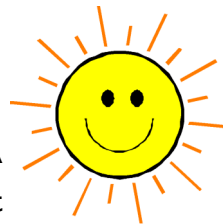
game, which is very fast paced. We are pleased to say that Bexley were the

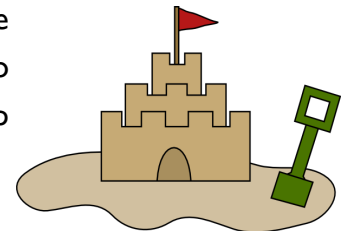
