School closure due to bad weather :

We always strive to stay open during periods of snow etc., but occasionally this is not possible due to members of staff being unable to get in, or if the school site is deemed unsafe for pupils. In the event of a school closure up to date information will be available on www.bexley.gov.uk/winter

Coming in to watch performances :

It has come to my attention that on days when the children are performing or we have an event taking place in school that the school foyer becomes congested and rather unsafe for children or staff to move in school. It is also classed as a fire evacuation risk. From now on when the children are performing and you are waiting to come into school you will be asked to form an orderly queue outside the main office doors. The office staff will then let you in once the school day has started. I would appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

How does attendance affect progress ?

Attending school regularly is very important and coming to school on time is paramount. As a school we are striving to improve our attendance. Research clearly shows that attendance and your child's progress they make in school are linked. By not coming to school regularly could really hinder your child's attainment. If your child's attendance falls below 95% you will now receive a letter; However this table clearly shows the effect poor attendance will have on your child's progress.
