**Curriculum Intent and Implementation**

What makes Bexley special to us and how we can communicate that with others.

**Build on personal attributes:** teamwork, independence and confidence, pride and personal safety.



**Curriculum Impact:**

The children were taken to an immersive storytelling performance at Erith Library. The children were transported to Parbexia and 100 years into the future.

After a welcome a song from the cast, the children explored the 'Parbexia Museum of Bexley' where the cast explained the different artefacts that they had collected from 2019 Bexley, such as a Christmas tree with a bottle of Fairy washing up liquid on the top. The children had to share what makes Bexley special to them on notes. Later in the performance, these were used to help remind the cast what was special about their own planet to help it from being dissolved.

Through the whole performance the children were engaged and enjoyed interacting with the cast

in trying to correct their misunderstandings – particularly about how humans are not born out of Kinder Eggs!
