<p>Curriculum Impact:</p> <p>In June 2019, Year 3 pupils had the opportunity to be part of a new piece of artwork, created by the filmmaker Steve McQueen. Over 76,000 children across London took part in this project, making it one of the most ambitious portraits of children ever undertaken in the UK. On the 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019, Year 4 pupils visited the Tate Britain to observe the final product in which they featured. The portrait offered us a glimpse into the capital's future.</p>	

When we arrived at the Tate Britain, we were taken to a room in which each of the class photographs were projected onto a large screen. The children were amazed by how much younger they looked! After this, we were set the challenge of finding both photographs within the gallery itself. There were many bays full of portraits; however, ours was at eye level so we identified it within the first few seconds of being shown to the correct section. It was incredible to see the diversity of children across the borough of London, and how different classes looked in terms of gender make up, ethnicity and size (some portraits had only 5 children in them!).

Once we had reflected upon our time in Year 3 and the future we hope to be part of, we had a bit of time to explore some other parts of the gallery. These portraits were painted centuries ago, and looked very different to the photographs that were taken of us!
